We are fortunate at Valley Brook to have many opportunities for involvement. The reasons we come together include:

As matter of information, please allow me to mention the financial status of the Valley Brook church. You have been faithful in giving, enabling us to meet obligations and continue our budgeted ministries. While our annual budget is very conservative, we can be proud of our congregations' response in the area of financial stewardship. You need to know, however, that we recently lost a regular donation source, resulting in a 6% reduction in our anticipated annual receipts. My response has been: "God will continue to bless the Valley Brook Church, our people, our giving and our wise use of His resources."

How can you help? Consider your own giving. Are you prayerful, careful and systematic? Is God pleased with your financial management, including offerings to the church? Perhaps this is the time to begin giving according to God's plan, the tithe. Some may be able to increase their giving by 6%. Not an additional 6% of income, merely a 6% increase in the offering amount: that amounts to six dollars per hundred.

Talking about money is never comfortable, but as your pastor I feel it my duty to keep you informed and offer solution possibilities. Please prayerfully consider your response.

A special thanks to our Nominating Committee. This team has done a commendable job filling many positions for the 2009-2010 church year. Thanks to them and the many who willingly accepted important positions.
