What have you read lately? It's a question we hear regularly and those of us who love to read are eager to answer, telling others about our experiences between the pages. I enjoy occasional fiction, some of the classics, biographies and study materials. Each of us is different in our appreciation of books.

One book, however, stands out above all others. Of course I am referring to the Bible. It is a must read for anyone because of its significance and literary status. Any well informed person will make themselves familiar with this "Book of Books."

This book is the basis of our belief. We do not worship the Book; we worship the Lord of the Book. But it is here that we understand how to believe, how to live and how to have an eternal relationship with the Lord.

The Bible is unique. It was written over a 1500 year span by more than 40 authors from every walk of life, including kings, military leaders, peasants, philosophers, fishermen, tax collectors, poets, musicians, statesmen, scholars, and shepherds. It was written on three continents; in three languages, using a wide variety of literary styles. The Bible addresses hundreds of controversial subjects.

In spite of its diversity, the Bible presents a single unfolding story: God's redemption of human beings. The unifying thread is salvation from sin and condemnation, to a life of complete transformation and eternal joy in the presence of God. Among all the people described in the Bible, the leading character through-

out is the one, true, living God made known through Jesus Christ.

The Valley Brook Baptist Church declares in our constitution and by-laws:

We believe the Bible was written by men divinely inspired, and is a perfect treasure of heavenly instruction, that it has God for its author, salvation for its end, and truth without mixture of error, for its matter; and therefore is and shall remain, the true basis of all Christian union, faith, practice and the supreme standard by which all human conduct, creeds and opinion should be tried. The criterion by which the scriptures are to be interpreted is Jesus Christ.

The Bible is the Word of God. Make it priority reading; glean from its pages on a regular and systematic basis.

Numbers that Count for a Healthy Heart

Thirty minutes of exercise.

Blood Pressure less than **120/80**.

Fasting glucose less than **100 mg/dL**.

Body mass index (BMI) less than **25**.

To calculate your BMI, first convert your height to inches. Then take your weight and divide it by your height in inches squared. Finally, multiply that number by 703. A BMI of 25-29.9 is overweight and a BMI of 30 or more is obese.

Waist circumference of **35** inches or less for ladies and **40** inches or less for men.

Total cholesterol lower than **200 mg/dL**.

People at lower risk for heart disease should have a LDL of no more than 160mg/dL. People at higher risk for heart disease, your LDL target level should be less than 130mg/dL.

Forgo ATM receipts: Do Mother Nature a favor and just say no. If every American skipped cash machine receipts, it would save a roll of paper more than two billion feet long and reduce one of the top sources of litter on the planet.
